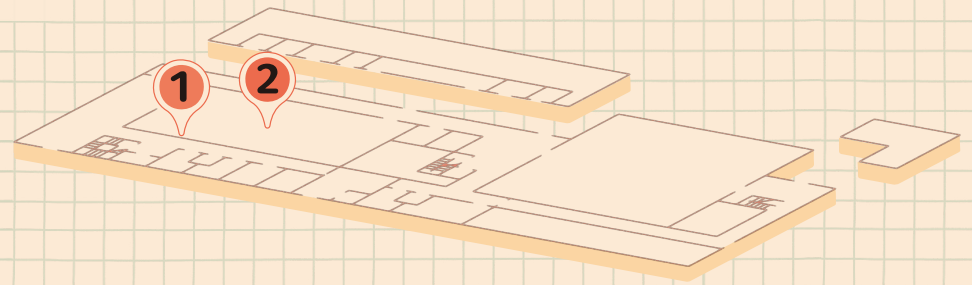
Container City

Imagine a city as a huge, enchanting treasure box where many different people, plants, and animals live together.

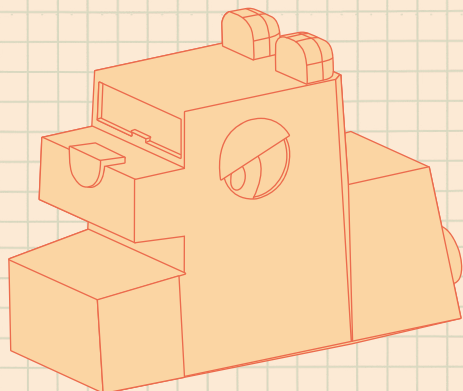
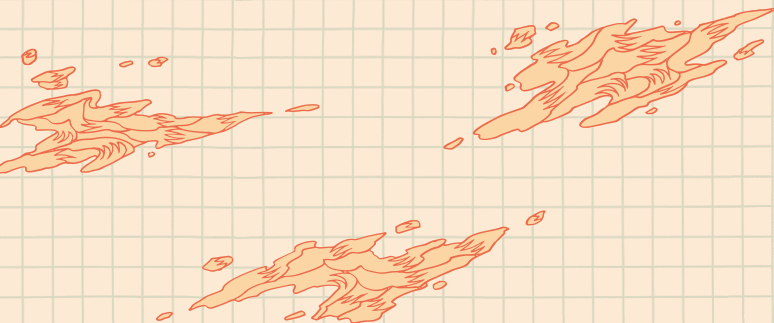
What stories are hidden inside the Container City?

1 REACH, *CITY MAP*

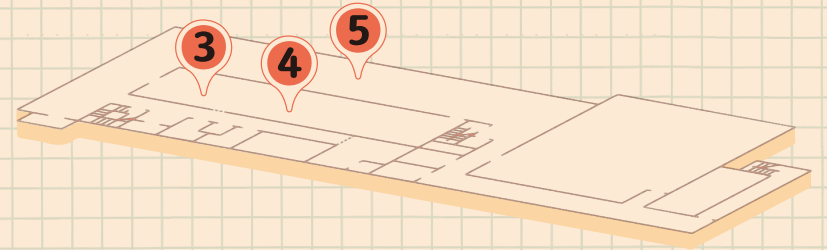

2 Lee Wen-Cheng, *Good Neighbour*

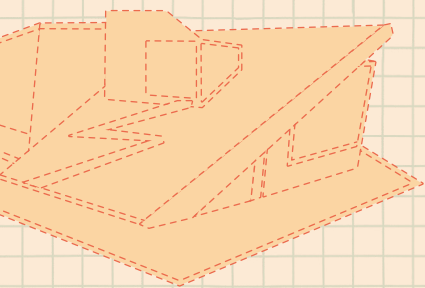
Imagine becoming the main characters in a game, hunting for presents, meeting neighborhood friends, and zooming around in little cars across the city. Let's visit our neighbors together!

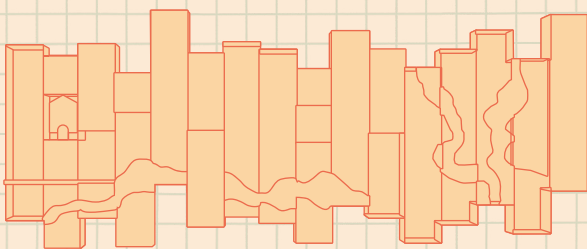


3 Deng Wen-Jen, *Qingpu Time Travel*

The artist uses delicate hand embroidery and machine sewing to create maps full of Qingpu history and tales, guiding us through a hundred years of Qingpu's past.

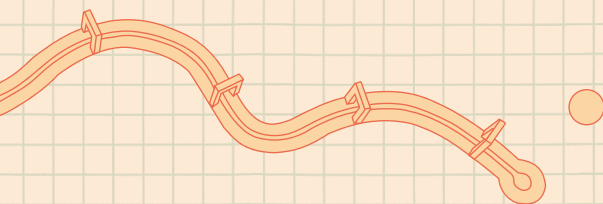
4 Chiu Chieh-Sen, *Time Map*

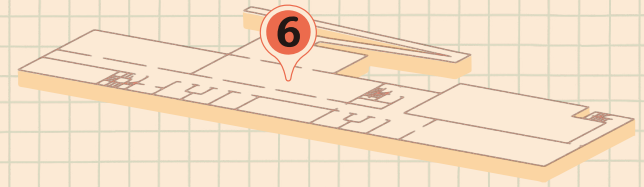
5 Tuan Tsun-Chen, *Traces of the City*

Down a winding path, a ball rolls along, going through arch after arch. As we push the ball, we bend, twist, and reach out, turning into the city's busiest visitors.

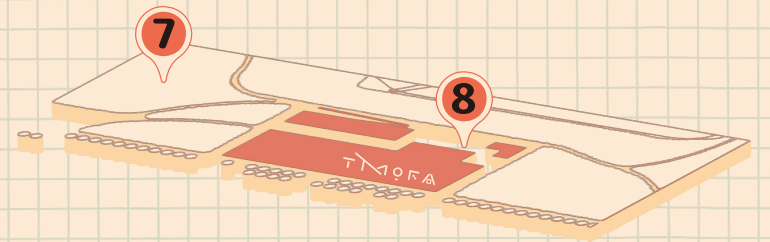


Nature City

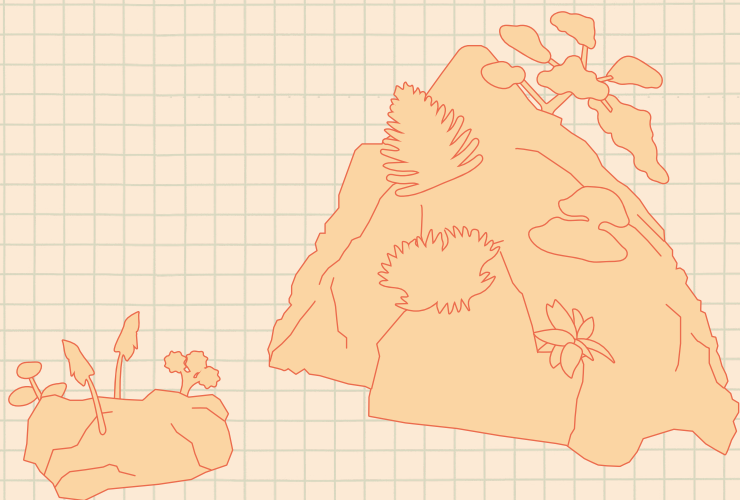
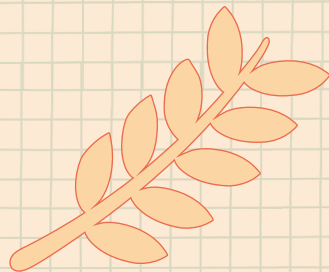
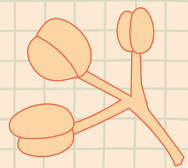
Imagine we're flying high in a plane. Looking down, the sunlight makes the ponds shimmer, like bright, watery eyes. Streams and large irrigation channels crisscross the city. Taoyuan Children's Art Center in Chintan Park, resembling a hill and surrounded by nature, features artificial mountains and hills, channels echoing the sound of water, and playgrounds transformed from seeds, welcoming you to nature within the city.

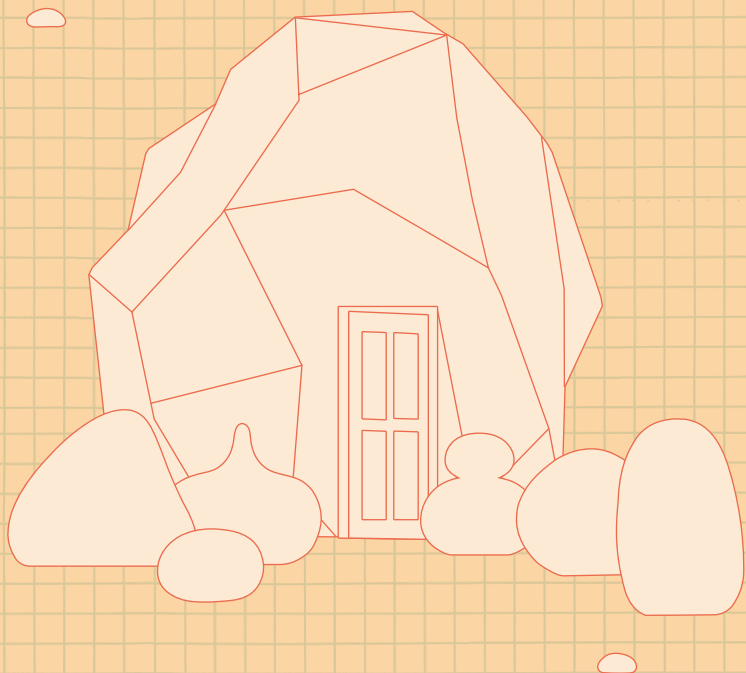

9 Artwork Story

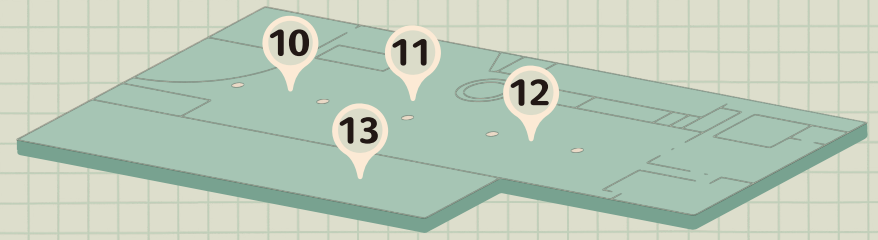

If you spend time with his baby rocks, he will open the door to rock wisdom from around the world.

The place where we live is surrounded by factories, with tall buildings built on the edge of fields. People from different ethnic groups have come from the mountains, from the sea, and even from different countries to live together. In the cities we moved to, we learn to build houses, and those who were once encircled by mountains weave green forests in the city, drawing maps of their hometowns from memory and returning to the homes they miss through songs and smells.

11 Alie Tamapima, *Half and Half*

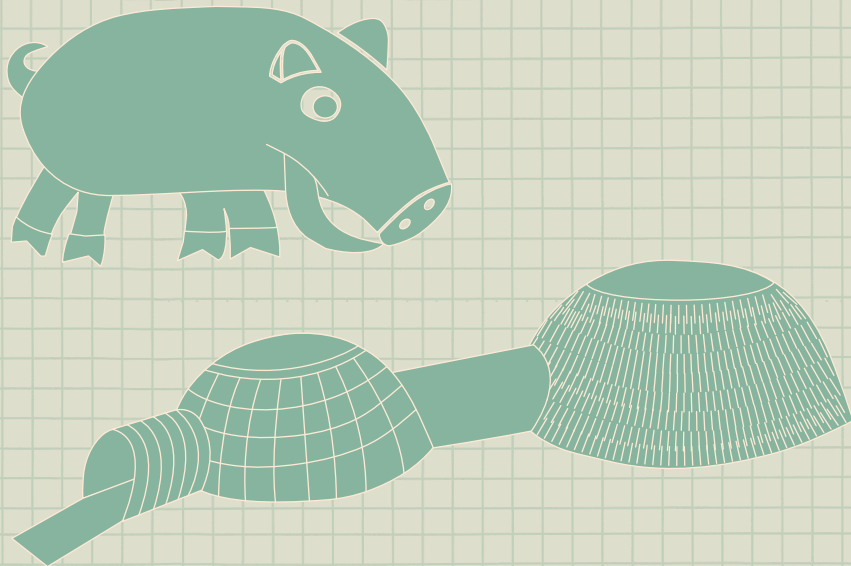
Being half indigenous and half from the plains, I often feel that I don't belong to any particular group. I move along with the times and the mixing of cultures: "I am half and half."

12 Wang Hsiu-Ju, *Little Worlds*

My parents moved to the city for work, while my grandparents still live in the far-off mountains, by the sea. Whether it's the crowded city or the vast wilderness, both are my little worlds, my cozy corners.

13 Lu Chien-Ming, *Beneath the Wing*

Imagine a giant bird's nest, as fluffy as chicken feathers. We play, rest, and chat under its protective wings, all while the sweet smell of rice drifts around us. This house, built together by artists and students, invites you into its embrace, a hidden fort inside the center.

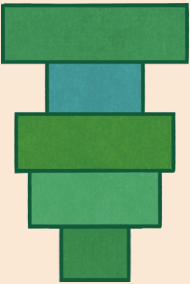
